Night work planned for pipeline segment

Fairfield, California (Thursday, January 5, 2017) — The six-month, pipeline construction work recommenced on January 2 along Railroad Avenue between Sunset Avenue and Humphrey Drive in Suisun City to install a new water transmission main to connect existing water pipelines at either end of Railroad Avenue, and a new storm drain to alleviate flooding problems in the area. On completion of the pipelines, new paving will be installed to improve the existing road surface.

Construction hours for the project will generally be Monday through Friday, from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Businesses and residents may experience increased truck and equipment traffic, noise, dust, and vibrations during construction. Motorists are encouraged to use alternate routes, as traffic diversions and road closures will be in effect for much of the project.

Access to residents will remain available during construction, and regular construction alerts will be distributed to notify the community of the nature and timing of the work and its potential impacts.

The cities of Fairfield and Suisun City are looking forward to the needed pipeline installations and rehabilitation of the Railroad Avenue pavement, and greatly appreciate your cooperation. Please adhere to the project construction signs when travelling in the area during above noted hours, and use alternative routes when applicable.
