Fairfield, California (Friday, February 10, 2017) – Back by popular demand. Free confidential paper shredding and electronic waste and used clothing drop off events for 2017 start on Saturday, March 25 and will run until October 28. The events are from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the corner of Jackson and Empire streets. Events are open to all local residents, businesses, and nonprofit organizations. A Certificate of Destruction can be provided if requested.

Identity theft can be avoided by safely destroying your confidential papers and e-waste. Be careful when donating personal computers or electronic devices to companies that may sell your items along with your personal information. Be sure to only donate your computers or personal electronic devices to companies that securely wipe out the personal data and recycle them.

These free events are provided through a partnership with the City of Fairfield, Fairfield Main Street Association, Solano County and UCP of the North Bay.
