Fairfield successfully recycles in 2017

Fairfield, California (Friday, December 8, 2017) — City of Fairfield, United Cerebral Palsy of North Bay, Solano County, and the Fairfield Main Street Association would like to thank everyone who participated in the free confidential paper shredding, e-waste, and used clothing drop off events this year.

The events were well received and extremely successful. In 2017, Gone for Good shredded and recycled 60,700 pounds of confidential papers, and recycled 21,200 pounds of electronic waste. In addition, UCP of North Bay repurposed 520 pounds of used clothing through their thrift stores.

Since 2014, Gone for Good has shredded 164,000 pounds of confidential papers, recycled 77,300 of electronic waste, and collected 3,050 pounds of used clothing. To put this amount of recycling over the past four years in perspective, an average American car weighs 4,000 pounds or 2 tons – the weight of about 61.5 cars has been recycled.

These free events were provided through a partnership between Gone for Good, the City of Fairfield, Fairfield Main Street Association, Solano County, and UCP of the North Bay. The events will resume in March of 2018 in Downtown Fairfield. Please check the City of Fairfield's website to verify the dates and times - www.fairfield.ca.gov/Recycling.
