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### Fairfield releases annual water quality report

**Fairfield, California (Thursday, June 28, 2018)**—The City of Fairfield released its 2017 Consumer Confidence Report, detailing the quality of tap water as it compares to State Water Resources Control Board and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency standards. The report includes details about where Fairfield's water comes from and what it contains.

Fairfield's drinking water is sourced from Lake Berryessa and the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta, and is treated at the Waterman Water Treatment Plant and the North Bay Regional Water Treatment Plant. Based on a series of tests, the quality of Fairfield's drinking water exceeds almost all industry standards.

A lot goes in to making safe, quality drinking water, and the City's Public Works Department is pleased to report that it continues to supply very high-quality water to its customers.
