Zero tolerance for personal fireworks

Fairfield, California (Tuesday, June 25, 2019) — The City of Fairfield is reminding residents of its anti-fireworks campaign focusing on possible injury and death as a result of using fireworks. Its exploding video message opens with the words “I’m Back - Don’t be a Dummy” and shows how dangerous fireworks are by demonstrating with test dummies while reminding residents to celebrate the holiday safely.

The personal use of fireworks can result in injury, death, emergency room visits, and extensive property damage. The City thanks you for your cooperation not using personal fireworks. Your cooperation is paramount in keeping the community safe.

Police and Fire Department staffing will be increased in the days surrounding July 4. A dedicated team of proactive officers may respond to calls related to fireworks, parties, and disturbances. Citations may be given to any citizen found making, buying, selling, or using fireworks.
